The John H. John H. Taggart Elementary School GOALS

At least 70% of K and 50% of 1st and 2nd grade students will score at Target by the Spring AimsWeb Assessment. At least 65% of students will attend 95% of days or more.

No more than 35% of 3rd grade students will score Below Basic on the 3rd grade PSSA-ELA.

No more than 20% of students in grades 6th – 8th and 4th and 5th will score below basic on the Math PSSA. At least 60% of K students and 75% of 1st grade students and 2nd grade students will make one year's worth of grow No more than 25% of 3rd grade students will score below basic on the 3rd grade PSSA-ELA assessment. No more than 20% of students in grades 6th-8th and 4th and 5th will score below basic on the ELA PSSA

SCHOOL/TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES:

John H. Taggart Elementary School will:

The School District of Philadelphia Pennsylvania Core Curriculum drives our instruction specifically for ELA, Math, Social Studies and Science. Through the use of assessments our staff monitor student achievement. Classroom teachers utilize several assessments such as STAR, iReady, DRA 2s, Teacher-made Assessments, Predictive Assessments and PSSA. During Professional Development and Common Planning Time meetings, teachers collaborate and use data based on assessments to drive instruction.

Standardized tests include PSSA and standardized assessments for our LEP bilingual population. Benchmark tests, $PSSA \setminus Points$ and Assessment Anchors will also be used as a mechanism to monitor student growth.

By means of our School Website, Class Dojo, monthly calendars, emails, and parent meetings, John Taggart School families learn about the standardized assessment program. Individual results of these assessments are shared with parents when report cards are distributed. School-wide results are shared with parents during the school improvement planning

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

We, as parents, will:

Monitor attendance and ensure the child arrives at school on time. Ensure that all assigned homework is completed and ready for review. Parents/guardians will be responsible for monitoring the amount of television children watch, and limit the use of social media.
